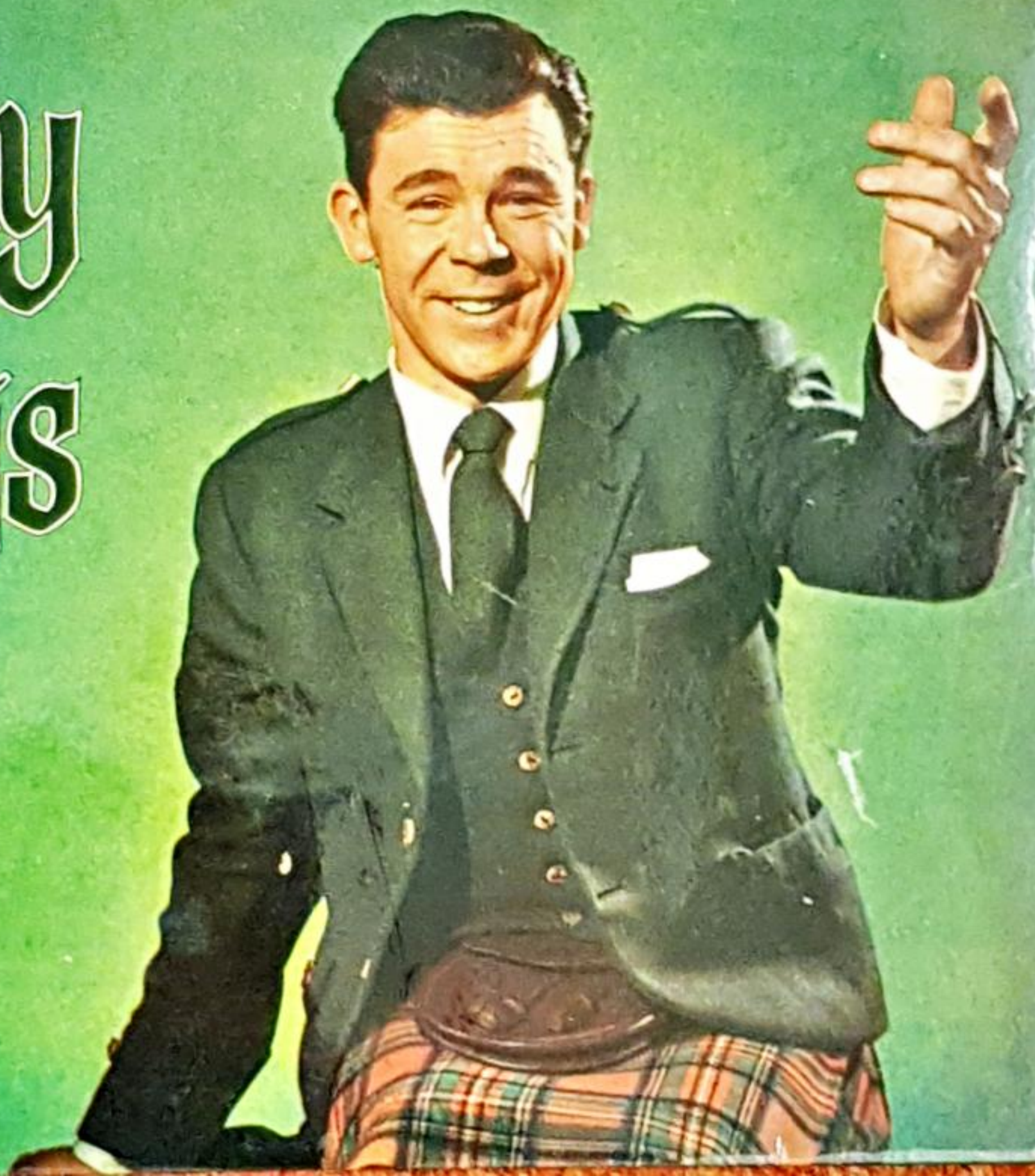

Andy has been singing for as long as he can remember, but it is really only since he wrote the words for *The Scottish Soldier* and sang it in the BBC Television Production of the "White Heather Club" that he has taken his singing at all seriously. He is, even now, far more pleased with having written the lyrics for this famous song than with his singing of it.

For those who are not fortunate enough to be able to see Andy Stewart perform, this EP will give some insight into the rare gift he has for individual expression. He does not just sing, he acts his songs, which is not surprising since he began his theatrical career as a student of dramatic art in Glasgow. Since those days he has become an extremely able impressionist and comedian and has conquered that most difficult of mediums, Television. He is a household name in Scotland and his recordings are rapidly spreading his fame throughout the world.

On this EP, Andy sings both the opening and closing songs for the White Heather Club; both items are continually being requested on records. *McGinty's Meal And Ale* is a comedy song which, though well-known, obtains a freshness in this sparkling performance. *O Come With Me* is a delightful song written by Andy himself, as is *Oh Kate!*
